Electricity Company Ghana

The Electricity Company of Ghana was incorporated under the companies code, 1963 (Act 179) limited by shares on the 21st day of February, 1997.

The primary objective of the company is to supply electrical energy to people in its areas of operation. In discharging its various duties, the company also executes programmes of national electrification on behalf of the government.



Petroleum Products Pricing Regulatory Agency (Nigeria)

The PPPRA was established by the Petroleum Products Pricing Regulatory Agency (Establishment) Bill, 2003 as an autonomous Agency to determine the pricing of petroleum products and regulate their supply and distribution. The PPPRA, by its mandate, also has the responsibility to midwife the deregulation policy of the Federal Government in the downstream sector.



Power Holding Company Nigeria (Nigeria)

The **Power Holding Company of Nigeria** (abbreviated PHC or PHCN), formerly the National Electric Power Authority (abbreviated NEPA) is an organisation governing the use of electricity in Nigeria.

The government has divided the current PHCN distribution sector into separate companies or entities that will be called Local Electric Distribution Companies or Local Distribution Companies (LDC) among the regions.



Volta River Authority (Ghana)

The Volta River Authority (VRA) was established on April 26, 1961, under the Volta River Development Act, Act 46 of the Republic of Ghana.

The Authority's primary function is to generate and supply electrical energy for industrial, commercial and domestic use in Ghana.
